

DISTRICT PROGRAMS

Citizen's Advisory Board – This board, in place since 1988, assists the local office with delivery of services to offenders and has oversight of a Victim Impact Panel, delivered to offenders on a bi-monthly basis.

Victim Impact Panel – This restorative justice program is presented on a bi-monthly basis, and provides offenders an opportunity to view crime in general, and their particular crime, from the viewpoint of the/their victim(s). This project is overseen by the Citizen's Advisory Board (CAB).

Drug Court Program - Drug Courts currently function in both Pettis and Cooper County, with a total potential caseload of 50 offenders.

Offenders Offering Alternatives - District 29 has a long-standing affiliation with this program, with staff serving on the Board of Directors. Led by inmates housed at MSP, and conducted at that facility, this program is designed to assist offenders under supervision in making more productive decisions.

Pathway To Change – This cognitive skills-building program is offered to offenders on an as-needed basis, in both Pettis and Cooper County.

COMMUNITY RESOURCES

MRP Steering Team – On a monthly basis, this grass roots team of service providers, law enforcement personnel, corrections staff and local citizens meets to coordinate delivery of services to offenders, with a specific focus on enhancing the smooth re-entry of offenders from correctional institutions to the community.

Sex Offender Treatment – All persons convicted of sex offenses must undergo a regimented and approved program of treatment, as a part of their supervision in the community. D29 staff oversee the delivery of treatment services, working closely with the treatment provider, to assist with offender rehabilitation.

Substance Abuse Treatment – **Substance** abuse in the offender population is a serious and pervasive problem. Staff in D29 join with treatment professionals to monitor offender alcohol and drug problems, with effective treatment and eventual recovery as expected goals.
